1 Our School

1.1 Brief Introduction

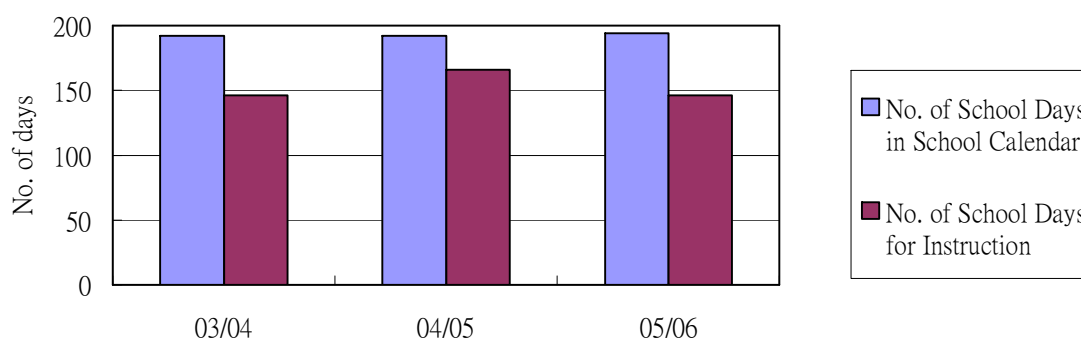
Shung Tak Catholic English College is an aided secondary school in Yuen Long sponsored by the Catholic Diocese of Hong Kong. The old school campus was situated in Shui Pin Village, Yuen Long, and was relocated to the present premises in Hung Shui Kiu in 1992. Non-denominational and co-educational since its founding in 1958, the school is now operating 29 classes, from S.1 to S.7, with approximately 1200 pupils, aged 11-19. The school now prepares students for the Hong Kong Advanced Level Examinations, the Hong Kong Certificate of Education Examinations, and the new Secondary School Diploma.

1.2 School Management

Our school joined the School Management Initiative Scheme in 1996 to implement school-based management. The SMC then strongly believed that such a revamp of the school management would certainly enable the SMC to hear more positive voices on school improvement and empower the school administration to formulate initiatives to enhance students' learning outcomes.

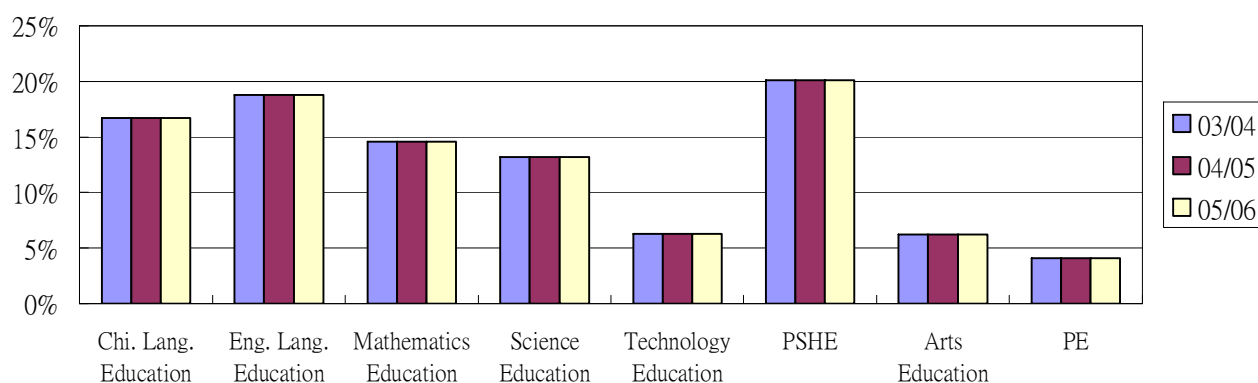
Upon the completion of the School Improvement Programme in October 2005, the school now has two new extensions, the lower annex and the Edward Wong Kwong Wing teaching block, which all together provide students with an additional floor area of almost 2000 square meters for learning and activities.

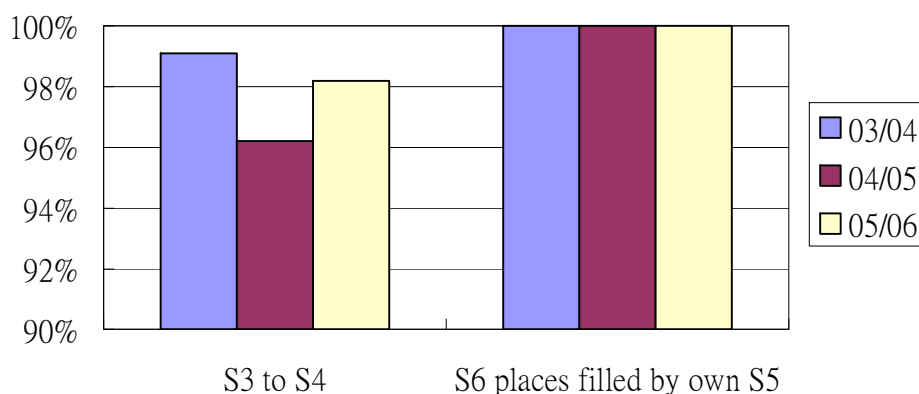

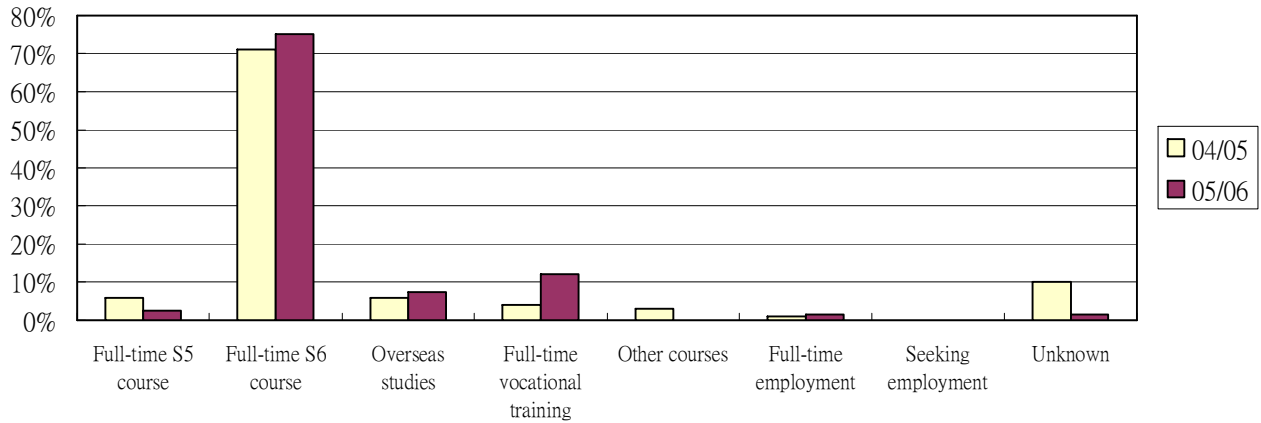


2.3 Unfilled Places

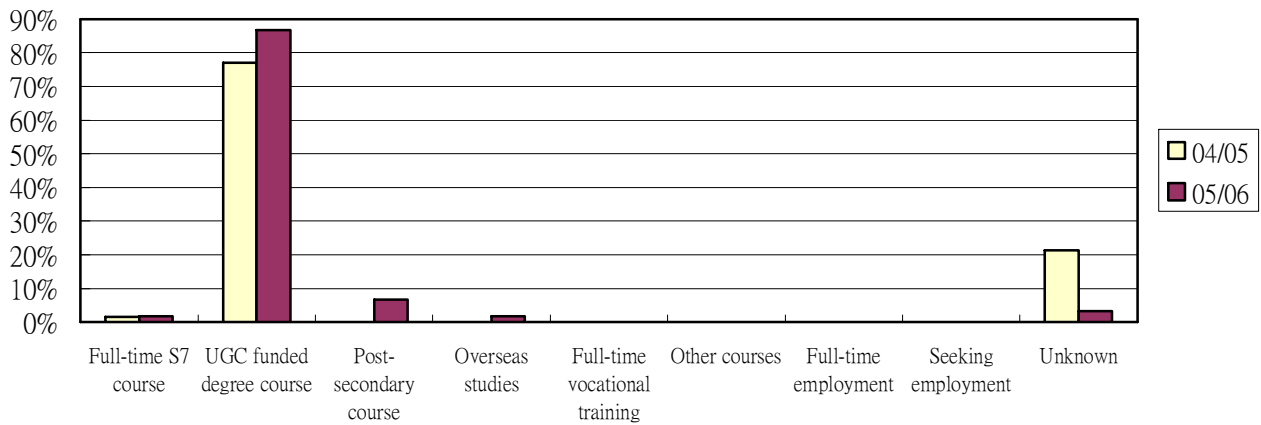

2.4 Destination of Exit Students, including early exits

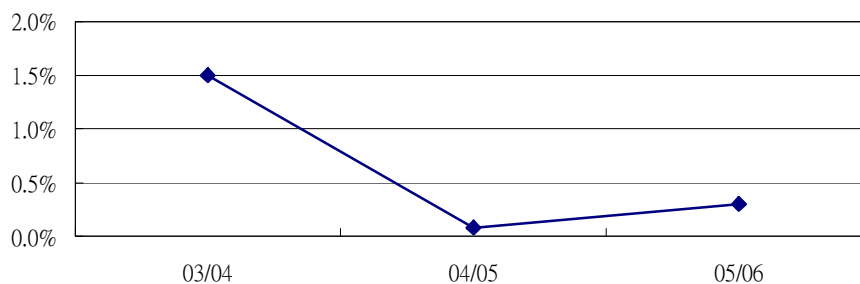
Pursuits of Secondary 5 Graduates



Pursuits of Secondary 7 Graduates

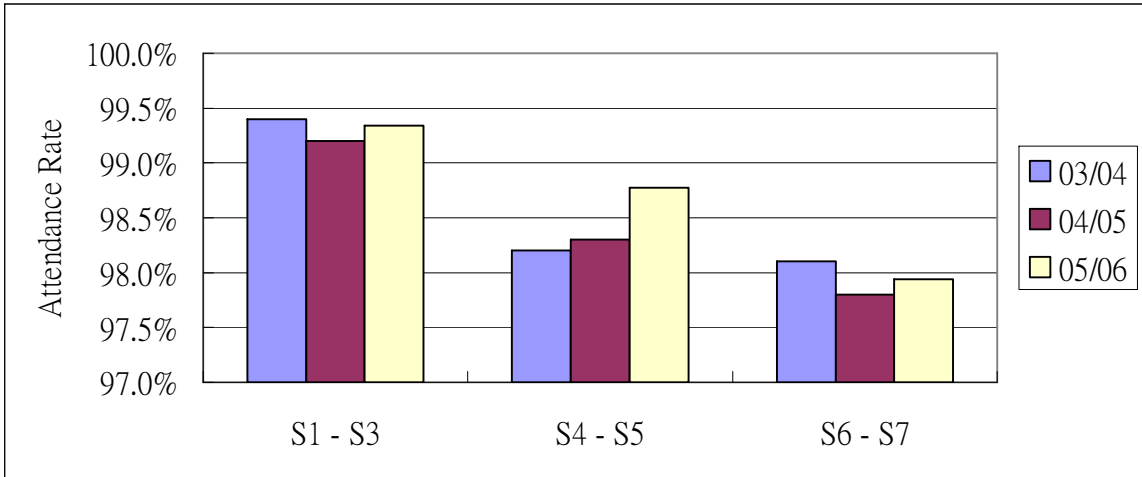


Percentages of student early exit in the past three years.

Our student attendance rate is always high. In the past 3 years, the rate of each level was over 98%.



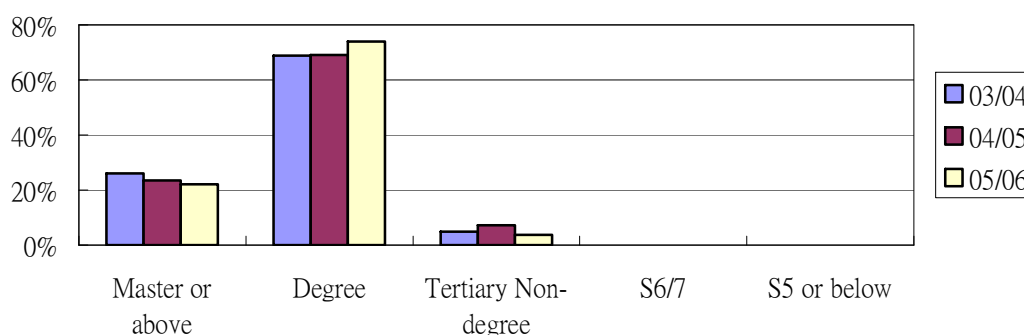

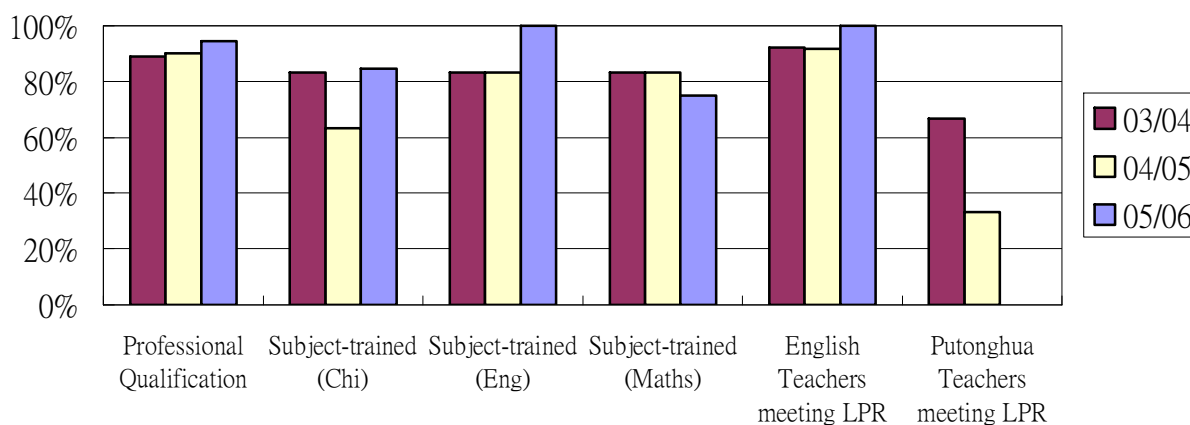

Percentages of teachers' highest academic qualifications in the past 3 years



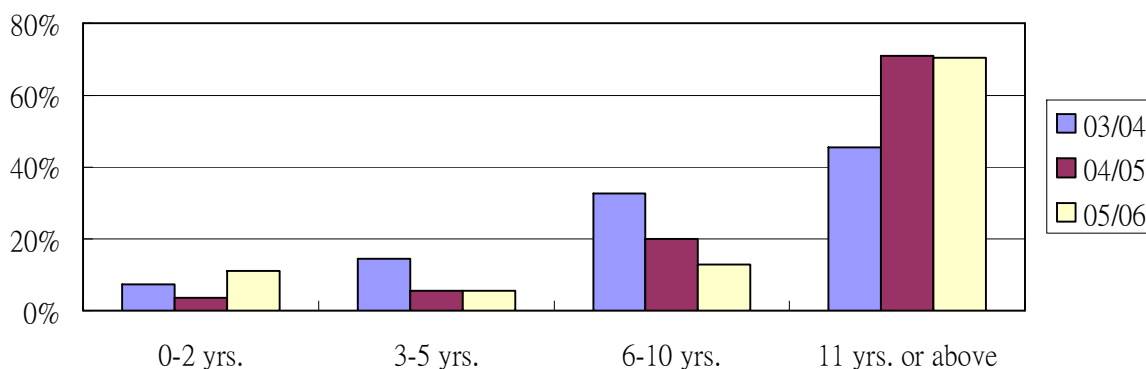
Professional status of teachers in our school:

3.3 Teachers' Professional Development

A great majority of our teachers showed high aspirations for multi-faceted professional development and took part actively in various courses organized by the Education Manpower Bureau and other educational bodies. Most teachers and the principal met the required number of the CPD hours.

Our school also paid due attention to school-based staff training and development programmes. The major ones were:

- Three staff development days were held in the 05-06 academic year. Many significant issues pertaining to effective teaching and learning such as ‘Enhancement of Students’ Learning Initiative’ and ‘Building up a More Serious Attitude towards Completion of Assignments’ were tabled for discussion and on each occasion the response was overwhelming. The last staff development was spent on formulating the major concerns for 2006-09 and the preparation of the External School Review.
- Our school completed for the third time the two-year QEF sponsored programme ‘Improving the Quality of Education for All (IQEA)’, focusing on ‘Communal Lesson Planning’ and ‘Interactive Teaching’.
- Experienced teachers were assigned to new teachers as mentors to help them cope with the new teaching environment.

4 Major Concerns (Achievements and Reflection)

Major Concern 1: To make mixed ability mode an achievable experience in Shung Tak

Over the past three years, the school has exerted great effort on dispelling the anxiety caused by labelling effect from students in the weaker classes. We modified the class division of S.1 to S.3 from streaming to mixed ability mode and renamed the classes after the five Saints, namely, John, Luke, Matthew, Peter and Silas instead of A, B, C, D and E. The same mode has also been adopted in S.4 and 5 science and arts streams. On the basis of shared responsibility, the School Authority, subject departments and functional departments endeavoured to formulate policies and initiatives to translate our First Major Concern into results since its inception in September 2002.

Extra efforts were made by the three core subject departments to enhance students' learning outcomes. Both the Chinese and Mathematics departments operated remedial classes in S.2 while S.5 Mathematics teachers conducted extra enhancement and remedial classes on Saturday mornings. Setting was adopted in S.4 by the English department with the School-based Assessment carried out as part of the teaching and learning process.

To maintain the heterogeneity of the education we provide, other subject departments and functional committees also adopted measures to support the mixed ability mode. Through appropriate integration and coordination, a number of approaches and activities were launched to help students explore and develop their potential: popular leadership training courses and ball-game courses organized by the ECA and P.E. departments respectively, the Art-in-Art approach adopted by the Art department to help students acquire basic knowledge and skills in the art creation and appreciation of artwork, collaborative learning through practical work by the Science department, commendation letters and scholarships in recognition of students' achievements by the Awards committee, visits to large corporations to broaden students' careers outlook by the Careers department and day camps by the Counselling committee to step up students' self-esteem and enhance their communication skills.

Since its implementation three years ago, much has been done to help students realize their intellectual, imaginative and creative potentials and the full success of mixed ability mode remains to be seen but some encouraging outcomes are observable; our results in the 2006 HKCEE reached an all-time high, our students achieved flying colours in various visual arts works competitions, class discipline has significantly improved over the past three years and unruly behaviour on the campus is no longer a common sight.

Major Concern 2: To enhance all students' motivation in their learning in order to achieve positive value-addedness in all subjects in public examinations

The 2005-06 academic year was a vintage year for STC. Our S.5 students made history again and scored 129 A's in the HKCEE, a new record in the history of Shung Tak. Amanda Kan Man Chi, the unbeaten top-notch student in all her years in Shung Tak, reaffirmed her top caliber with flair and panache by scooping ten A's and became a household name in the district. The results of our S.7 students in the HKALE left nothing to be desired; the percentage of our university admissions 2006 is over 93. According to the Value-added Reports on school performance released just recently, we scored very high stanines in Chinese Language & Culture (AS), Chinese Literature (AL), Use of English (AS), Biology (CE), Chinese History (CE), Economics (CE), English Language (CE), Geography (CE), Mathematics (CE) and Physics (CE). All the above are solid evidence of our teachers' unswerving commitment to help students achieve good results in the two public examinations.

A variety of measures were also taken across all levels by various departments and committees collaboratively to enhance students' motivation to learn. In conjunction with the Health and Civic committee and the school social worker, the Counselling committee launched a programme called "Enhancement of Students' Learning Motivation" for S.1 students and was warmly received by its participants. Interactive and learner-centred approaches were employed by different subject teachers to arouse students' interest and maximize their participation in the lessons. The English department organized two-day thematic English Activities Days three times last year to provide students with ample opportunities to use English in authentic situations.

Uploading tailor-made learning materials including video clips of students' class performance on the school intranet to cater for learner diversity has become a common practice. The Summer New Leaf Assessment Scheme for less able students to redeem their unsatisfactory performance in the school examinations proved to be highly conducive to enhancing learning outcomes. Other enrichment classes and remedial classes for S.1-3 students were operated after each organized test and the interim examination to ensure value-addedness in each individual student. The S.4 and S.5 tutorial classes on various subjects sponsored by the Sun Hung Kai Property Ltd. Education Fund were run successfully.

Among the teachers themselves, a culture of sharing took place in the school through the implementation of regular "communal lesson preparation" and peer lesson observation in all subject departments with a view to enhancing students' learning outcomes.

All the above contributed significantly to the pleasing results of our students in the two public examinations.

Major Concern 3: To create, with the Catholic Education as the basis, a caring and prayerful school environment

As a Catholic school, its ethos reflects the fundamental Christian value of duty to God and concern for others. We advocate a simple and fulfilling school life. Both our sponsoring body and SMC give priority to nurturing students to become caring, considerate and compassionate children of the Creator.

To translate the above belief into action, the school endeavoured to foster a caring and prayerful environment on the campus through a series of activities organized by various subject panels and functional committees in the 2005-06 academic year.

With a strong belief that the campus will be imbued with love and care through saying prayers, the Religious Studies department provided each student with a free copy of the prayer book to use at morning assemblies. In October, the month devoted to Our Lady of the Rosaries, junior secondary students were brought to the Marian Shrine to pray. Two extra masses were given, one at Christmas time to celebrate the birth of Christ and the other in April for S.5 students before they sat for the HKCEE.

Through the exchange tours to Italy and New Zealand organized by the school, we provided students with opportunities to widen their global outlook, know more about different cultures and learn to care for a foreign friend who stayed in their home on the return tour in Hong Kong.

To nurture students' interest in aesthetic pleasure, the Art department displayed mural decoration painted by students on the walls along the corridors on the lower floors to awaken them to appreciate the beauty of nature created by God and its harmonious relationship.

A number of other meaningful activities were also organized to heighten the Shungtakians' social and civic awareness and thence learn to reach out to the needy. The English department supported "Operation Santa Claus" and raised more than \$30,000. The Science department collected 'young blood' from students to help those in need of blood on Blood Donation Day. The Counselling committee organized a series of activities to foster in students the spirit of "learning by serving". The Health and Civic department organized visits to an elderly home and a special school and two other activities, namely, "the Best Ten Guys in STC" and a slogan contest on "A Harmonious and Caring School Environment" with overwhelming response from students. All these activities were meant to awaken the Shungtakians' social conscience and turn on their heart light to shine on the less fortunate people.

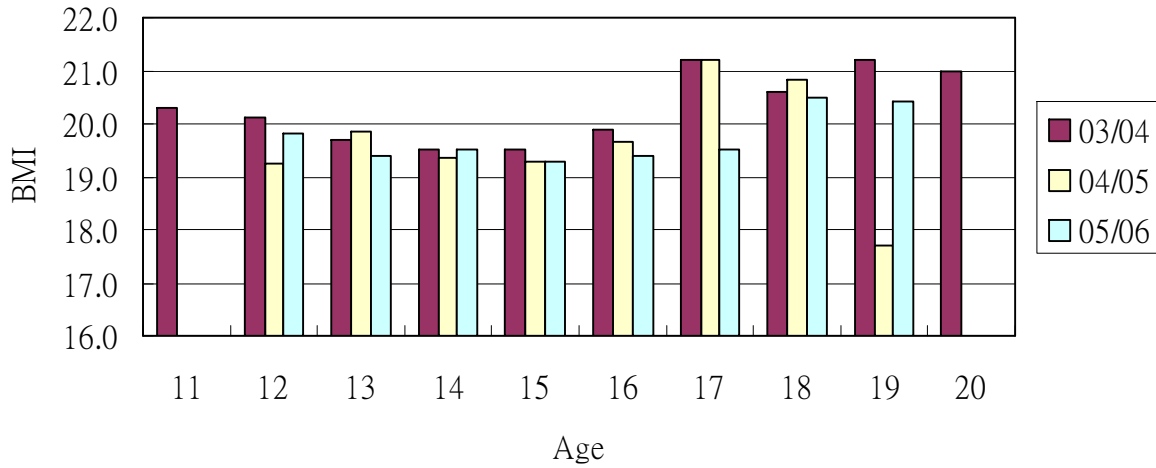

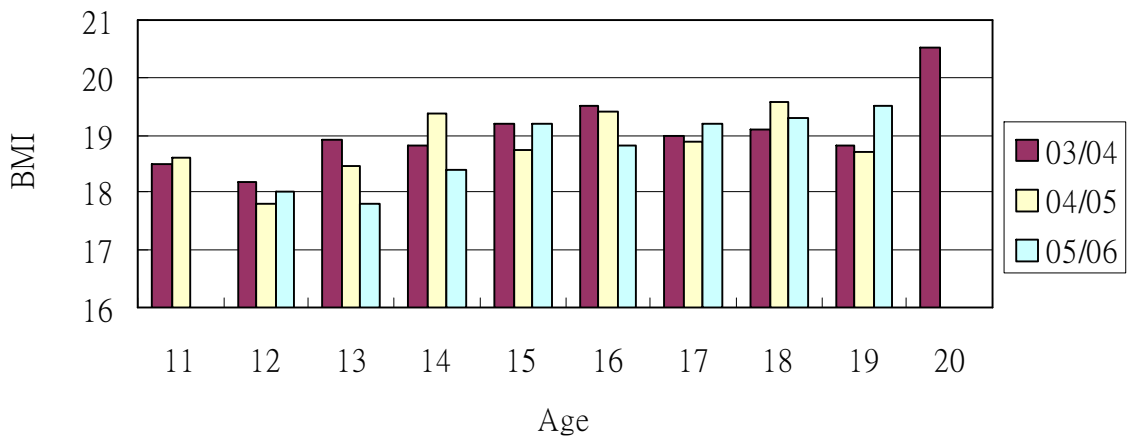

Body Mass Index of Boys (Normal range: 18.5 – 22.9)



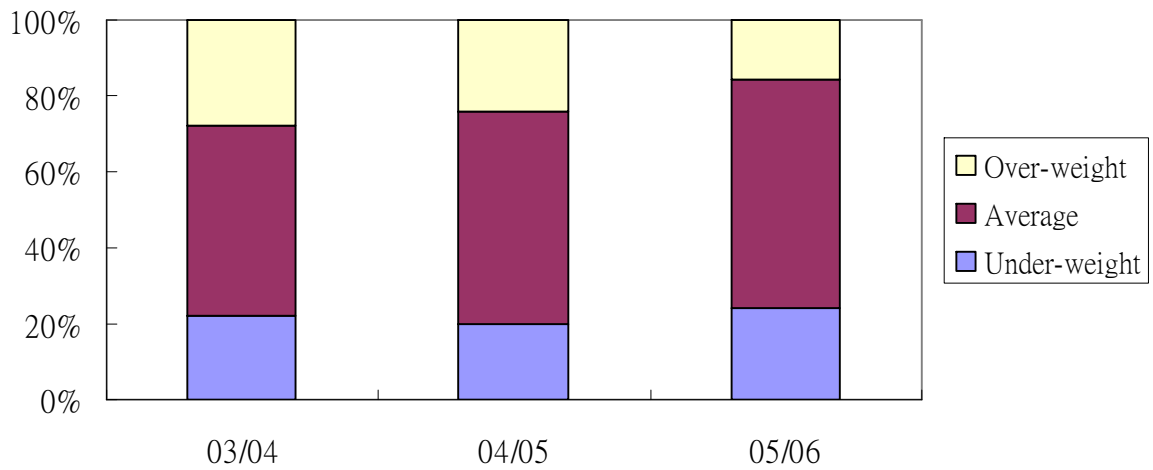
Body Mass Index of Girls (Normal range: 18.5 – 22.9)



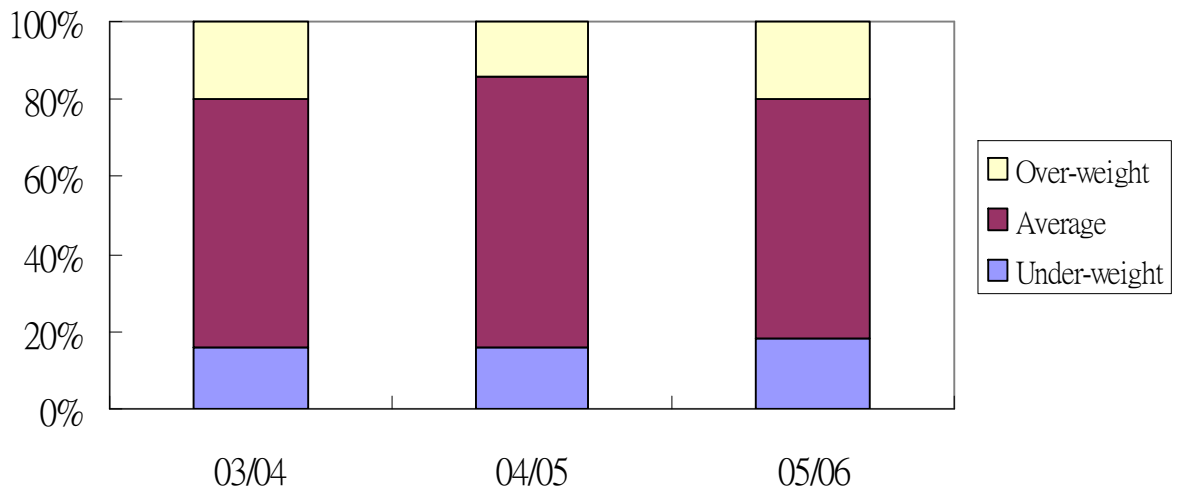

Students' Weight of Boys



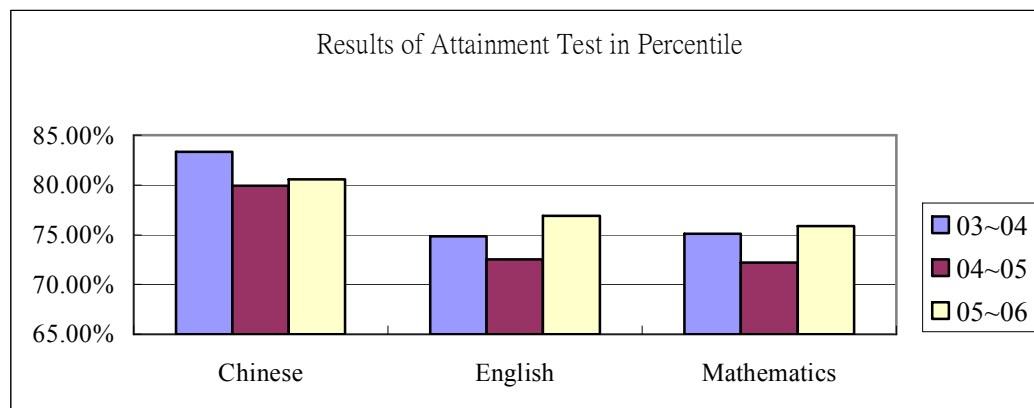

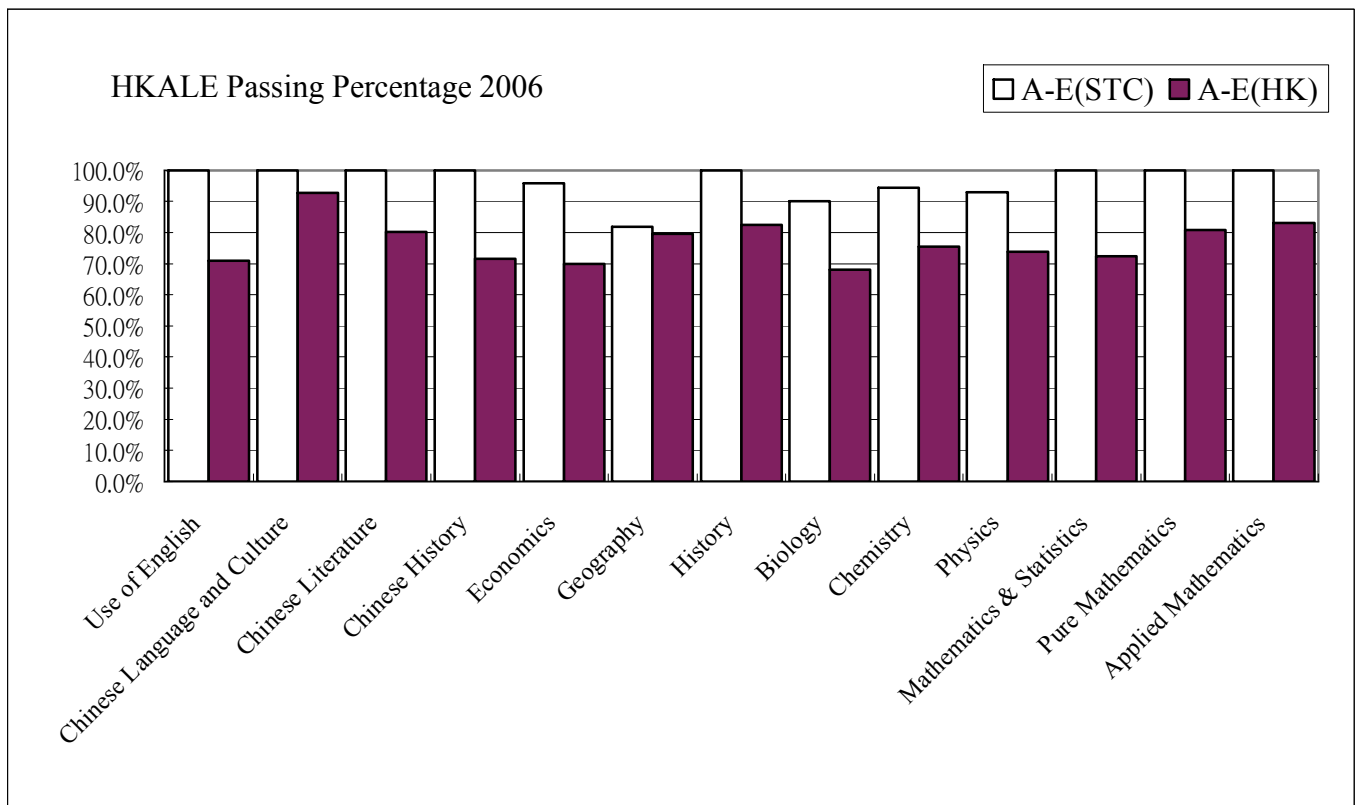

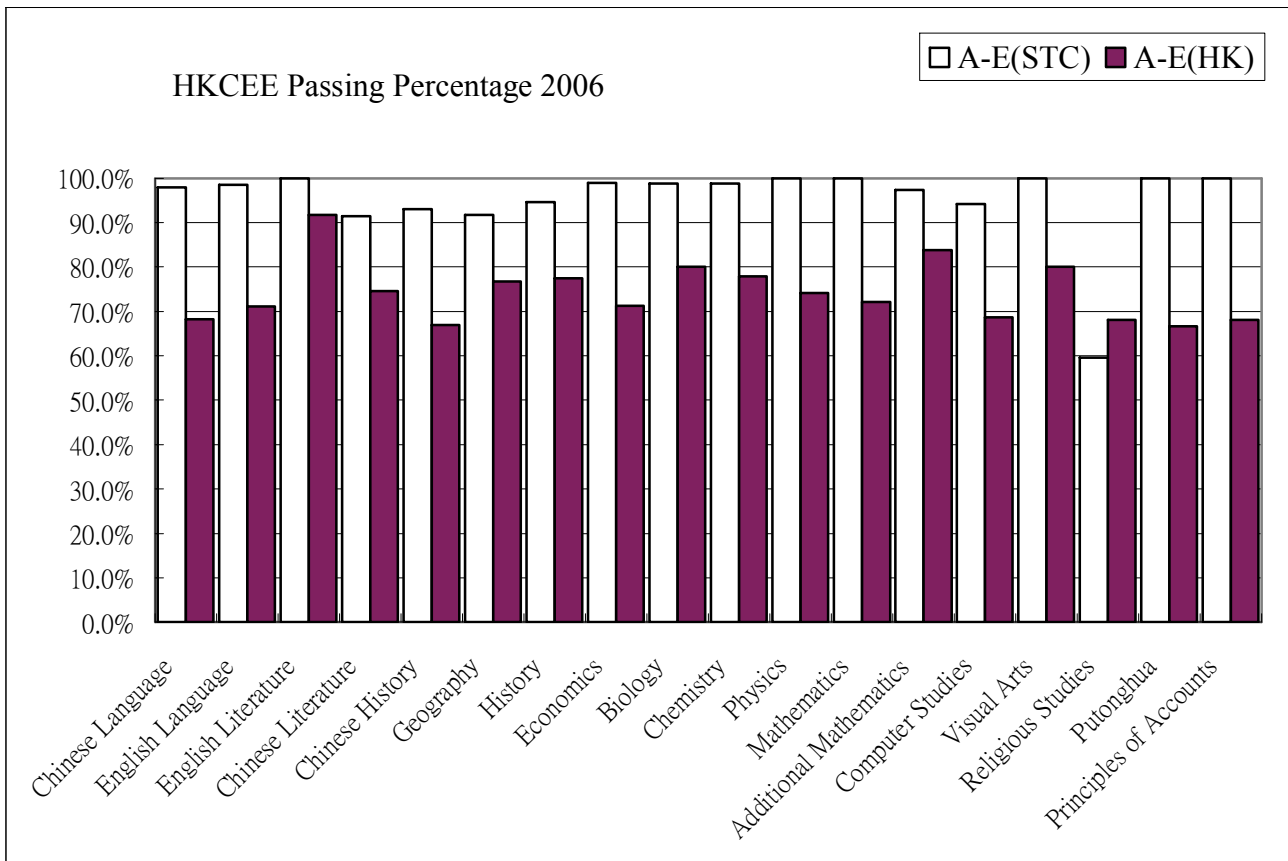
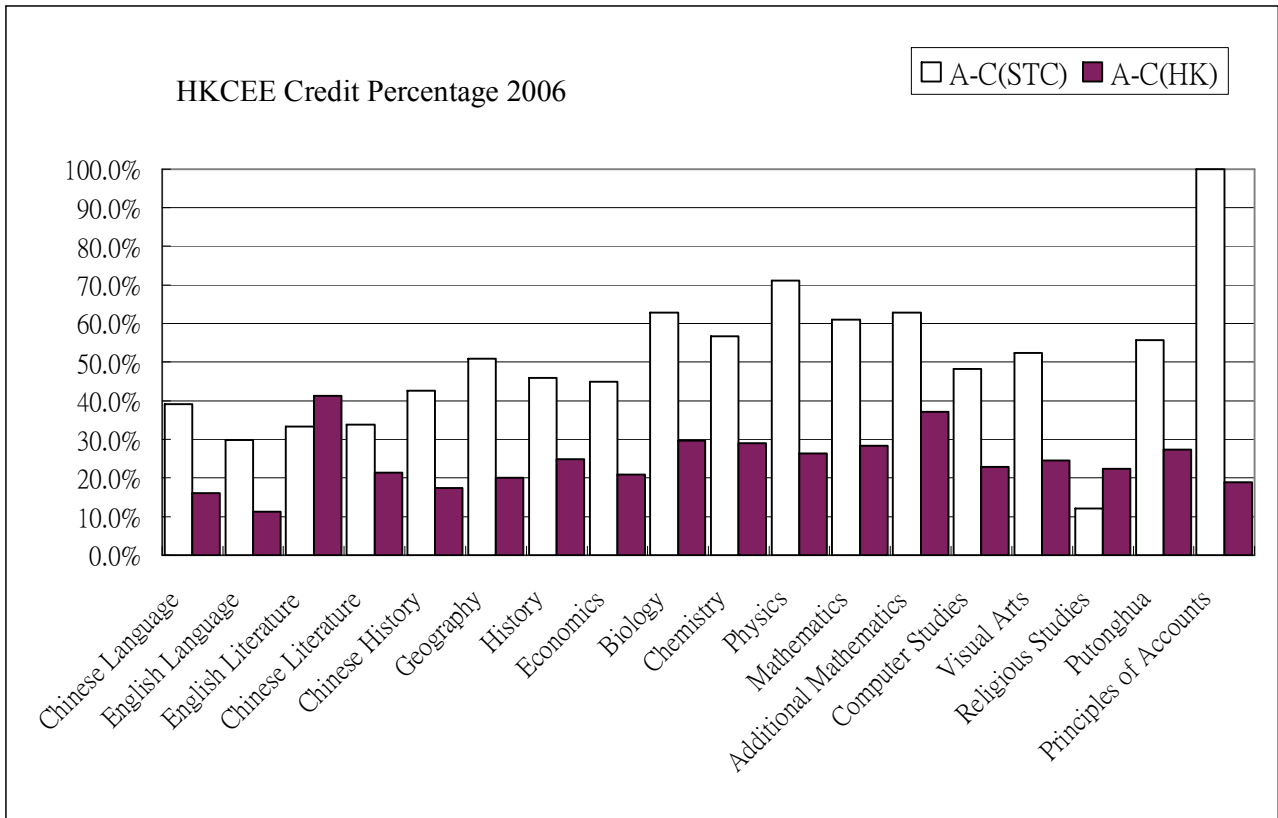

6.6 Students' Participation in Extra curricular Activities

The 2005-06 scholastic year was a significant year for the ECA committee as it had achieved its ultimate goal of laying a solid foundation for further development of extra-curricular activities in STC. Fruitful outcomes are not hard to find.

Over the last three years, the launching of the self-development project for S.1 and S.2 created both a direction and dimensions for the school to unearth and develop students' potentials in non-academic areas. Participants could choose one area out of art, music, and sports through their own wishes and develop their potential. Their horizons were considerably widened and they displayed leadership qualities at the end of the programme.

As for senior formers, training courses were organized to foster their leadership skills. The leadership programme for S.3 and S.4 students was proved to be a great success with due regard given to their excellent services for the school throughout the year. Now a system is in place to train student leaders in school and we are sure that Shungtakians will be able to find enough room to develop their leadership.

Aside from coordinating extra-curricular activities within the school, the ECA Committee also helped to publish SU newspaper, arrange interflows with other student organizations with our SU, conduct consultative meetings, allocate the Life Wide Fund to applicants, and coordinate monthly extra-curricular activities. The scope of the ECA has been broadened and the committee is able to provide more comprehensive and higher quality services to students.

In sum, the ECA committee has made great effort to promote the whole person development of the students. In the near future, the committee will focus mainly on the concept of extended activities and life wide learning to be in articulation with a new initiative in the New NSS Curriculum - 'Other Learning Experience'.
