
Healthy School Policy 2023-2024

A. Objectives

- To help students reach a state of physical, psychological and social well-being
- To help students have a healthy and joyful life
- To develop students' healthy lifestyles, positive attitudes and values, practical life skills, and the skills to 'say no' (refusal skills) as they resist temptation so that students can face the challenges in their personal growth.

B. The structure

- The Principal is the advisor of the Healthy School Policy.
- The Vice Principals (VPs), the Assistant Principals (APs), and the executive members are responsible for the work of planning, coordinating, monitoring, evaluating and modifying STC Healthy School Policy.
- The whole person development (non-academic) task group and the Identification & Referral Team are responsible for planning, implementing and assessing the programmes related to healthy lifestyles, positive attitudes and values, practical life skills, and refusal skills to resist temptation.
- The school would adopt its in-house referral system to identify the students needing help and tackle the issues arising from them.



C. The Tasks

- A WhatsApp group formed to facilitate coordination among members.
- Each committee/department would decide the programmes of its own and submit the Programme Plan before September. The VPs and APs facilitate the collaboration so that the work can be done in a more effective manner.
- An overall picture would be made for reference and collaboration.
- Each committee/department would prepare the progress report and evaluation report of its own programmes. The work of evaluation should be kept in the minutes of the meetings of each committee/department.
- An overall evaluation of the work would be included in the Annual School Report.
- A VP would report the evaluation of the work in the staff meeting.

D. Theme of this year

- a) Developing the awareness on drug abuse among students, parents and teachers.
 - Formulation of a school policy on handling drug abuse cases.
 - Providing continual professional development for teachers and staff to identify and handle drug abuse cases.
 - Offering opportunities for students to participate in life-wide learning activities to enhance their resilience against drugs.

 - Strengthening home-school cooperation to create an environment conducive to the healthy development of students and teachers.
